RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PAMBULA A.H.&P. SOCIETY Inc

1	In so far as these Regulations are concerned "Committee" will mean the committee of the Pambula A.H.&P. Society Inc and the 'Judges' and 'Stewards' will mean Judges and Stewards acting on behalf of the Pambula A.H.&P. Society Inc.
2	The Pambula A.H.&P. Society will not be responsible for any accident caused through or by any exhibit and not under any circumstance hold itself responsible for any loss or mis-delivery or ANY exhibit of any kind, or for any damage to one thereto.
3	Exhibitors must supply persons competent to take charge of all horses and stock, and all led horses must be haltered.
4	All entries must be lodged as directed in the relevant Pambula Show program on or before the day appointed for receiving same.
5	No exhibits will bear any mark of ownership, <u>except where otherwise stated in the program.</u>
6	A "Novice" exhibitor in any section is one who has never won a first prize in that particular class. (Novice categories have now been discontinued in the Pavilion) .
7	Entry fees are set out in the relevant sections of the Schedule. Entries will only be received up until the time specified in the Schedule.
8	The Committee has the right to refuse any entry without stating any reason.
9	Any exhibitor must sign a Statutory Declaration, if called upon by the Committee, failing which he/she may be disqualified.
10	A Chief Steward shall be appointed by the Committee in each Section.
11	All sections of produce, crafts etc. and all commercial exhibits and any other displays whatsoever shall be placed in the position allocated by the Chief Steward.
12	The Stewards, under the direction of the Chief Section Steward, shall be responsible for the effective arrangement of the exhibits on the stands and may take such action as they deem necessary in this direction.
13	The Stewards will, under the directions of the Committee, have entire control over the exhibits in their respective Sections and, co-jointly with the Judges, will sign the award papers. The Principal Stewards in each Section will attend on the Judges when called upon and are authorised to prevent intrusion during the time of judging and also ensure strict adherence to all conditions relating to the exhibits.
14	An Exhibitor in a Section may act as a Steward if so appointed by the Committee, but shall not accompany the Judge during or preceding deliberation.
15	The Pavilion will be closed to the Public while judging is in progress.
16	The Judge in any Section may disqualify from the competition any exhibit or competitor not conforming to the necessary requirements or contravening any regulations or condition of that particular section.
17	THE DECISIONS OF THE JUDGES ARE FINAL.
18	Only ribbons won at the Show in progress will be allowed on exhibits.

19	The award of 'Champion' will only be awarded in any Section at the Judge's discretion.
20	Exhibits shall not be removed from the stands in the Pavilion until permission is granted by the Chief Steward.
21	Non-competitive exhibits will be allowed, but a fee may be imposed for exhibits of an advertising nature.

Post-processing of digital images is recognised as part of modern photography, in the same way that darkroom techniques have been used with film cameras. Subtle optimisation of images is therefore permitted in all classes. Additionally, classes 7 and 17 are available for images resulting from more extensive digital manipulation.

All prints must be mounted on stiff paper or cardboard and conform to the following sizes mounted:

Minimum - 22cm by 15 cm Maximum - 40cm by 30cm

RICH FRUIT CAKE

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The Australian Dried Fruits Association Rich Fruit Cake Competition at the Pambula Show is sponsored by the Pambula A H & P Society. The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants. NOTE: Cakes should be baked in a square tin.

250 gm (8 oz) sultanas
250 gm (8 oz) chopped raisins
250 gm (8oz) currants
125 gm (4 oz) chopped mixed peel
90 gm (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds
90 gm (3 oz) chopped red glace cherries
1/3 cup sherry or brandy
250 gm (8oz) plain flour
29 gm (2oz) self-raising flour
¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg
½ teaspoon ground ginger
½ teaspoon ground cloves
250 gm (8oz) butter
250 gm (8oz) soft brown sugar
½ teaspoon almond essence
½ teaspoon vanilla essence
4 large eggs

Mix together all the fruit and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20 cm (8 inches) and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3.5 to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: to ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested that the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 –4 pieces. Winners at Country Shows will each receive a cash prize of \$5 (in addition to the prize money offered by the sponsor with the local Society) and will be required to bake a second 'Rich Fruit Cake' in order to compete in a semi-final to be conducted by each of the 14 Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW. The fourteen winners at Regional level will each receive a cash prize of \$10 and are required to bake a third 'Rich Fruit Cake' for the final judging at the Royal Easter Show where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$50.
